Opinion

We have audited the Statement of Liquid Capital of Arif Latif Securities (Pvt.) Limited (the Securities Broker) and notes to the Statement of Liquid Capital as at June 30, 2021 (together 'the statement').

In our opinion, the financial information in the statement of the Securities Broker as at June 30, 2021 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the requirements of the Third Schedule of the Securities Brokers (Licensing and Operations) Regulations, 2016 (the Regulations) issued by the Securities & Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP).

Basis for Opinion

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution

We draw attention to Note 2 to the statement, which describes the basis of accounting. The statement is prepared to assist the Arif Latif Securities (Pvt.) Limited (the Securities Broker) to meet the requirements of the SECP, Pakistan Stock Exchange (PSX) and National Clearing Company of Pakistan Limited (NCCPL). As a result, the statement may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for Arif Latif Securities (Pvt.) Limited (the Securities Broker), SECP, PSX and NCCPL and should not be distributed to parties other than Arif Latif Securities (Pvt.) Limited (the Securities Broker), the SECP, PSX or NCCPL. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
